### Cabinet Order No. 304

Order for Exercise of Authority by  
Railway Security Agent Outside  
Areas of Jurisdiction

In accordance with the provision of Article 4 of the Law concerning the Authority of Railway Security Agent (Law No. 241 of 1950), the Cabinet establishes this Cabinet Order.

**Article 1.** The Railway Security Agent may, in the case of a crime committed in or extended to, the area of a jurisdictional zone of another Railway Security Office within 500 meters of the jurisdictional zone of the Office to which he belongs, exercise his authority in that area.

**Article 2.** The Railway Security Agent may exercise his authority in the jurisdictional zone of any other Railway Security Office in order to apprehend the suspects or investigate criminal conduct in connection with crimes committed in, or extended to, either the jurisdictional zone of the office to which he belongs or the area of a jurisdictional zone of another Railway Security Office within 500 meters of the jurisdictional zone of the office to which he belongs.

**Article 3.** In the case of mass crime, disaster, serious emergency or danger to operations or safety, the Minister of Transportation may order the dispatch of any Railway Security Agent from his jurisdictional zone to the jurisdictional zone of any other Railway Security Office. When so dispatched the Railway Security Agent may exercise his authority in such other jurisdictional zone.

## LOCAL AUTONOMY MATTERS

### NARA PREFECTURE

#### Establishment of By-law concerning Charcoal Testing and Grading

In Nara Prefecture, the following By-law was established on July 5, 1950:

#### Nara Prefecture By-law No. 16

##### By-law concerning Charcoal Testing and Grading

(Purpose)

Article 1. The purpose of this By-law is to test and grade charcoal in order to have quality improved, production rationalized as well as to insure simpler and fairer trade and rationalized use or consumption of charcoal.

(Definition)

Article 2. The word "Japanese Agriculture and Forestry Standard" in this By-law shall mean that of Article 2 paragraph 2 of the Law concerning the Standard of Agriculture and Forestry Goods (Law No. 175 of 1950; hereinafter called the Law) and the word "Standard Certificate" shall mean that of Article 17 of the Law.

(Obligation of Test)

Article 3. The charcoal produced in this prefecture shall not be sold (including sale on commission and so forth), resold, exported, used or consumed unless the charcoal is tested under this By-law, excepting the followings:

- (1) Charcoal to which the standard certificate is tied by the appropriate organs of the prefecture;
- (2) Charcoal to be used or consumed in the prefecture by producer himself;
- (3) Charcoal to be transported to other places to be tested under Governor's approval due to topographical reason or other;
- (4) Charcoal to be transported for chemical test or exhibits, show or fair under Governor's approval.

2 Even charcoal imported from other prefectures, if not tested by other prefecture or deemed so, it shall be deemed charcoal produced in the prefecture.

Article 4. Charcoal applicable to the following items, even tested, it shall be deemed as not tested:

- (1) Charcoal which the standard certificate is missed or retied;
- (2) Charcoal which the standard certificate is not legible or forged (including a similar) or altered;
- (3) Charcoal which the net weight or quality is remarkably changed or packing is altered or damaged.

(Enforcement of Test and Grading)

Article 5. Test and grading shall be conducted under the Japanese Agriculture and Forestry Standard.

2 Governor shall stamp, mark and tie the standard certificate of each package of tested and graded charcoal.

3 The procedures of test and grading and other necessary matters as to the standard certificate, stamp and mark shall be provided separately.

(Statement of Dissatisfaction)

Article 6. Those dissatisfied of test and grading they had under the above provision may reach Governor with the reason of dissatisfaction.

2 Governor shall have to investigate or review the test and grading when dissatisfaction is brought forward or deemed necessary according to the provision of the preceding paragraph.

3 In addition to the preceding paragraph, other necessary matters shall be provided separately.

(Report and Test)

Article 7. Governor is authorized to have charcoal producers and dealers to submit necessary reports on charcoal production, test, shipment, sale, resale (including consignment thereof), transfer and stock and make officials concerned to get into business offices, depots or other places for inspection or order charcoal producers and dealers to submit necessary documents and objects when deemed necessary.

2 Officials concerned, when deemed necessary, are authorized to inspect charcoal on the way of transportation and order reshipping, repacking, stocking or to stop transportation.

Article 8. In the above case, the official concerned should carry his identity card with him to present it to the person concerned when requested.

(Penalty Provision)

Article 9. Violators of the provision of Article 3 shall be confined less than 2 months or fined less than 20,000 yen.

2 Those who neglect the report according to the provision of Article 7 paragraph 1 or refuse the inspection or submittance of documents and objects or make false report or violate the order of paragraph 2 of the same Article shall be fined less than 2,000 yen.



Supplementary Provision:

This By-law shall come into force as from July 10, 1950.

Nara Prefecture By-law No. 17

By-law concerning Charcoal Test Fee

Article 1. Applicants of charcoal test shall pay test fee in accordance with this By-law.

Article 2. Test fee shall be fixed 2 yen per 15 kg.

Article 3. The regulations necessary for enforcement of this By-law shall be stipulated separately by Governor.
