## MINISTERIAL ORDINANCE

### Ministry of Transportation Ordinance No. 14

May 28, 1947

A part of the Ministry of Communications Ordinance No. 65 of November of the eleventh year of Taisho (1922), the Regulations for Enforcement of the Law concerning Finding Employment for Mariners, shall be amended as follows:

Minister of Transportation pro tem.

Article 12-2 shall be deleted.

Article 19. A person who is engaged in the business of finding employment for mariners shall explain to the applicant the kind of employment to which he is to be recommended, conditions of the employment, discipline and other necessary matters for engaging in the labor on board, and make it sure whether the applicant has any objection against them or not.

Article 20. The service of finding employment shall be performed in the order of application, provided that this shall not apply to cases where a reasonable cause exists.

Supplementary Provision:

This Ordinance shall come into force as from June 2, 1947.

## COLLECTIVE INFORMATION

### GOVERNMENT MATTERS

#### Partial Amendments of the Regulations of Section Division in the Ministry of Education

The Ministry of Education made the following amendments to a part of the Regulations governing Section Division in the Ministry of Education and put them into force as from May 23, 1947:-

Ministry of Education

Art. 3. The School Education Bureau is divided into the General Affairs Section, the University Section, the College Section, the Normal School Section, the High School Section, the Secondary School Section, and the Primary School Section.

In the General Affairs Section, the following matters are handled:

1. Matters concerning the connection and adjustment of affairs within the jurisdiction of School Education Bureau;

2. Matters concerning teachers' salaries, allowances and other treatments;

• 3. Matters concerning the state payment of compulsory education expenses;

4. Matters concerning the mutual aid society of teachers;

5. Matters concerning teachers' unions;

6. Matters concerning scholarships;

7. Matters concerning pension foundations for private middle-schools;

8. Matters concerning repatriated teachers and students;

9. Matters not belonging to the other sections.

In the University Section, the following matters are handled:

1. Matters concerning universities;

2. Matters concerning universities and higher schools under the old regulations, as stipulated by the School Education Law, Art. 98;

3. Matters concerning schools of all kinds which belong to the same category as the above-mentioned;

4. Matters concerning the doctor's degree and other degrees and also the title of *Gakushi* (Bachelor);

5. Matters concerning foreign students in Japan;

6. Matters concerning Japanese students abroad;

7. Matters concerning the qualification or the certification of the teachers of higher schools under the old regulations, as stipulated by the School Education Law, Art. 98;

In the College Section, the following matters are handled:

1. Matters concerning colleges under the old regulations as stipulated by the School Education Law, Art. 98;

2. Matters concerning schools of all kinds which belong to the same category as that of the above-mentioned;

3. Matters concerning the approval of the qualification for the completion of colleges;

4. Matters concerning the Technical Arts Training Schools.

In the Normal School Section, the following matters are handled:

1. Matters concerning teachers' training;

2. Matters concerning those schools which primarily aims at the training of teachers;
